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ADDITIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES

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- Arrive to camp prepared to teach before campers arrive.
- Develop and implement an innovative and engaging curriculum for middle school students with support from Youth Success Manager and Director of Academic Success.
- Facilitate camp with support from Junior Teaching Artists and Camp Coordinator.
- Manage, Delegate, and Mentor Junior Teaching Artists
- Prior to camp, meet regularly with Youth Success Manager and Director of Academic Success to coordinate programmatic goals and needs.
- Involve campers in daily care and inventory of studio gear
- Provide materials/supplies list to Youth Success Manager at least two-weeks prior to camp.
- Attend and supervise campers as needed on off campus trips
- Implement Youth on Record's pedagogical framework and strategies
- Facilitate healthy, inclusive, and equitable classroom culture
- Abide by city, state, and federal rules and regulations
- Adapt to and support new ways of engaging in the current/post COVID-19 world
